**ASX RELEASE – FORMALISED SERVICES AGREEMENT TO SET UP VIETNAMESE-AMERICAN LIVER CENTRE**

The Board of Directors (“the Board” or “the Directors”) of **Asian American Medical Group Limited** (“AAMG” or “the Company”) refers to the Company’s announcement released on 17 April 2013 on the memorandum of agreement (“MOU”) between AAMG and Vinmec International Hospital JSC (“VINMEC”) to jointly set up a liver centre in Hanoi Vietnam.

Further to the said announcement, the Board is pleased to announce that the Company has entered into a three-year services agreement (“the Agreement”) to formalise the MOU. The setting up of a medical facility known as Vietnamese-American Liver Center (“VALC”) based at VINMEC International Hospital will commence in July 2013.

VALC is principally engaged in treating liver diseases for both adults and children.

The abovementioned transaction is not expected to have any material effect on the net earnings and net tangible assets per share of the Company for the financial year ending 31 August 2013.

None of the directors or substantial shareholders of the Company has any interest, direct or indirect on the abovementioned transaction.

About Asian American Medical Group

**Asian American Medical Group (“AAMG”)** is based on Singapore and has been listed on the Australian Securities Exchange since September 2009. The Group’s operations include the Asian Centre for Liver Diseases and Transplantation (“ACLDT”), established in 1994 in Singapore, and the Asian Centre for Blood and Bone Marrow Transplantation (“ACBBMT”).

ACLDT is regarded as one of Asia’s foremost Liver Centres with out-patient facilities as well as a dedicated in-patient Liver Ward and Intensive Care Unit to complement its highly successful Living Donor Liver Transplantation (LDLT) Programme. It is led by renowned hepatobiliary expert and liver transplant surgeon, Dr Tan Kai Chah (Dr K C Tan), who helped start the Liver Transplant Programme at the King’s College Hospital London, the UK. Dr Tan performed many pioneering operations in the UK including the first ‘split-liver’ transplant, first auxiliary liver graft and completed a pilot study of living donor liver transplantation.

ACLDT is the first private medical centre in South-east Asia to have performed more than 200 living donor liver transplants. On average, ACLDT treats 8,000 patients a year, of which over 90% are international patients from South-east Asia, South Asia, Indochina, the Middle East and Russia.

Launched in April 2013, ACBBMT offers Haematopoietic Stem Cell Transplant Programme and other blood related diseases. It is headed by the only transplant physician in the Asia-pacific region with specific training in haematopoietic cell transplantation for immunological diseases, Dr Yvonne Loh.

AAMG is collaborating with The University of Pittsburgh Medical Center (“UPMC”) to develop Asia’s first Comprehensive Transplant Centre (CTC) to offer quality treatment and transplantation for various diseases related to liver, kidney, blood and bone marrow.

Currently, AAMG has presence in Vietnam through a specialist liver centre in Ho Chi Minh City established in September 2010. In addition, it will also offer liver surgery for the first time outside Singapore, through its upcoming liver centre in Hanoi.
